Situation: The 48th AHC has completed its summer revelry in Orlando. Preparation continues for a full scale offensive and combat assault to the "little" burg of Williamsburg, located in the Colony of Virginia. The landing zone (to be further referred to as *LZ Williamsburg*) for this operation will be the Woodlands Hotel & Suites, 105 Visitor Center Drive, Colonial Williamsburg, VA. The assault will begin on November 9th and continue through November 13th, 2011. The operation will be declared complete when the last man standing departs the LZ.

Alright, now there's your "official" notice. Now let's get down to the nitty gritty. Janet Gay (with a little help from Ben Gay, and I mean little) has really put together a great program for us this year. Starting with finding us some great digs located right across from the Visitors Center in Colonial Williamsburg to our banquet on Saturday night. As most of you may know, this year marks the 5th anniversary of our Fall Reunion, a tradition that was started by Tony Terrana and Cliff Whiting. This tradition continues by reunion attendees having a little get together and cajoling someone into volunteering to host the next Fall Reunion. Fortunately for us (but not according to Janet ©), Ben has volunteered Janet twice now. I guess its called delegation of authority. Here's the low-down on the tentative schedule:

Sunday, November 13th Prepare for multi-sortie departure (those leaving on Sunday)

There are a multitude of places to visit while you're in Williamsburg. The Mariner's Museum in Newport News (home of the Monitor), Ft. Eustis Transportation Museum in Newport News, Museum of the Confederacy in Richmond, Williamsburg Winery Tour, Golf, Spa's and other Plantation tours.

Note: Anyone interested in a Civil War tour of one of the local battlefields, contact Ben Gay.

Hotel: The room rate for a standard room (two double beds) for single or double occupancy is \$89 per night. King size suites including queen size sofa are available for \$119 per night. Complimentary continental breakfast is included. This special guest room rate will apply 3 days before and after the dates of the event. A GP medium and cots will be provided in the adjacent wooded area for select individuals. For reservations call 800-261-9530 between 0830H and 1700H EST. Use booking Code #17008 or Group Name 48th AHC. Reservations must be made prior to Wednesday, September 7th, 2011. Reservation must be accompanied by a one night's deposit for room plus tax. Reservations made after September 7th will be based on space and rate available. Individual deposits are refundable, provided notice of cancellation is received by the hotel by 1700H EST at least 3 days prior to the reserved date of arrival. Check-in time is 1600 H and check-out time is 1100H.

Banquet: The Saturday night banquet will be at the Colonial Williamsburg Conference facility located within walking distance of our hotel (approx 1 ½ blocks). The menu will include a regional BBQ menu featuring such delights as chili-rubbed BBQ chicken breast, Virginia pulled-pork BBQ with all the fixins'. This year we're trying something a little different. We added a theme to this year's festivities and thought we'd try returning to the 60's with a 60's sock hop. Yep, that means we should get the hair slicked back, squeeze into those tight jeans and put on the T shirts (don't forget the rolled-up cigs in your sleeve). We've engaged the services of a DJ and have a dance floor. All this for the modest cost of \$37.50 each. You can't beat that with a stick! There will be a cash bar during dinner & the Sock Hop. It'll be real important to get your reservations and \$\$ in to Janet by September 7th. Please use the enclosed reservation form and send it to Janet ASAP.

T Shirts: By popular demand, we're going to have T-shirts available. The T-shirts will be dark green with a Huey slick and a gunship on the front, nothing on the back and no pocket. Sample artwork is included. Once again, if you're interested in ordering a T-shirt(s), please use the order form included. T-shirts will be available for pick-up in Williamsburg. If you can't join in the festivities, T-shirts can be mailed for an additional cost. T-shirts will be available around the beginning of November for mailing. This is a one-time deal. If you want one, order it now. We won't be ordering any extra's for "stock" so to speak. The deadline for ordering T shirts is October 10, 2011! Again, fill-in the order form and get it to Janet ASAP. See the T Shirt artwork on the back of the enclosed Association Membership Application!

Shelton Glass Works: We've got something special this year - 48th AHC REUNION HAND BLOWN COBALT MUGS. John Shelton has agreed to produce hand blown cobalt blue mugs with the 48th Blue Star inset into the mug.

The mugs that are being made for the 48th AHC will be hand blown by John Shelton of Shelton Glass Works, Williamsburg, Va. John is a former Viet Nam helicopter pilot who flew medevac missions in Viet Nam from 1967 to 1968. John then served in the Virginia Army National Guard (ARNG) in the 986th Medical Detachment/Air Ambulance with Ben Gay until his retirement in 1995. During his service in the ARNG, the 986th was activated and deployed to Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Iraq in 1990/1991 for 10 months during Operation Desert Storm. John has made his living as an independent glass blower from the mid 1970's to the present. John's work is not only known and highly respected nationally but also internationally, as he has produced specialty pieces for several European countries requiring 17th and 18th century pieces of the highest quality over the past 25 years. John has produced high quality individual pieces and collections for Colonial Williamsburg, the College of William and Mary, Jamestown, and other related historical sites over the past 30 years. John's work is highly sought after by private collectors of high end blown glass pieces and sets. John built his own glass furnace, mixes his own glass powder and uses the same tools as would have been used in the 17th and 18th centuries! John will be giving free demonstrations of his glass blowing skills in his shop in Williamsburg for members of the 48th during our reunion in November 2011 (see schedule). The "Blue Star" mug John will be making for our reunion will be offered at \$30.00 per piece. It will be made of Cobalt Blue glass and will have the Blue Star logo made of metal and attached to the mug. The mug design is of an 18th century drinking mug. A similar mug, made for the 986th Medical Detachment, is shown below. This piece of blown glass is a \$45.00 item, but John is offering it at his cost for our reunion. If orders are placed prior to the reunion, he will have the pieces ready for pick up in Williamsburg. If items must be shipped, that would add approximately \$22 per piece. Once again, if you're interested in ordering a mug, please use the attached order form. Again, this is a onetime deal. If you want one, order it now.

As an added attraction, John has generously donated a matching pitcher that we will be raffling off during the reunion.
